

Careers: Provider Access Policy September 2022

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1. Aims

This policy statement aims to set out our school's arrangements for managing the access of education and training providers to students for the purpose of giving them information about their offer. It sets out:

- Procedures in relation to requests for access
- The grounds for granting and refusing requests for access
- Details of premises or facilities to be provided to a person who is given access

2. Statutory requirements

Schools are required to ensure that there is an opportunity for a range of education and training providers to access students in years 8 to 13 for the purposes of informing them about approved technical education, qualifications or apprenticeships.

Schools must also have a policy statement that outlines the circumstances in which education and training providers will be given access to these students.

This is outlined in section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

This policy shows how our school complies with these requirements.

3. Student entitlement

All students in years 7 to 13 at Alder Grange are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of our careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships, e.g. through assemblies, careers fairs and drop-down day provision.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

4. Management of provider access requests

4.3 Granting and refusing access

Where possible, we will try to meet the requests of providers. In general we would arrange for providers to see students and their parents at an evening event, which means that students can access a wide range of providers on one occasion.

Providers can request access via an assembly, or it is possible that we may offer them a place at one of our events (such as the Careers Fair), depending on the age range being targeted.

Access to events will be subject to us being able to accommodate providers and will also depend on other factors, including the date of the request, in relation to the date of the event.

4.4 Safeguarding



Our Child_Protection & Safeguarding Policy, which is available from the school website, outlines the school's procedure for checking the identity and suitability of visitors.

Education and training providers will be expected to adhere to this policy.

4.5 Premises and facilities

For events in school, Alder Grange School will make a suitable room available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available equipment to support provider presentations.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature with our Careers Lead.

6. Monitoring arrangements
