



## The 16-19 Tuition Fund 2021 to 2022 Academic Year

### Statement on Use (as required by the Education and Skills Funding Agency)

This statement outlines how Alder Grange School intends to use the funding allocated to AG6 from the 16-19 Tuition Fund.

Students who are eligible to access this funding support are those identified by the Government as disadvantaged

- Students who have not achieved grade 4 or 5 or above at GCSE in either English or maths
- Students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and/or have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).
- Students who have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths **and** are from an economically disadvantaged background (defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived areas of the country based on the index of multiple deprivation)

Alder Grange will receive approximately £8,500

Alder Grange will use the funding in Academic Year 2021-2022 to support in the following areas:

- Support small group (max 5 pupils) tuition for those eligible students whose studies have been disrupted in English, maths, and other taught subjects
- Provide additional support in the form of tuition and/or small group work for those students with EHCPs
- Provide additional tuition and/or small group support to assist high achieving financially disadvantaged pupils, to reach their full potential

Alder Grange will primarily use our existing teaching and learning support staff to deliver the tuition; however where appropriate qualified teachers and tutors may be used.

The tuition fund is only to be used to fund the staff costs of providing the tuition, and we are informed we must not use this fund for equipment, laptops, or stationery. Where a student is in financial difficulty, and requires additional equipment to support their student should apply to the AG6 Bursary fund instead.
